The proposed plans are hyperlinked below with the same intensity and same density, so we have the same concerns. It is more important than ever to voice your concerns because the Frisbie Group informed us that they will also be seeking a zoning change to Residential Planned Development, which would allow them to build even more densely if granted.

We NEED YOUR INVOLVEMENT so these properties can be developed with the input and feedback of our residents, ensuring that they align with our collective vision for a vibrant and thriving community. We invite you to stay tuned for more detailed updates and information regarding these projects in the coming weeks.

WPB Named a 2023 Tree City USA®


The City of West Palm Beach proudly announces its recognition as a 2023 Tree City USA by the **Arbor Day Foundation**, in honor of its dedication to effective urban forest management.

The prestigious Tree City USA designation is awarded to communities that demonstrate exemplary commitment to maintaining and enhancing their urban tree canopy. West Palm Beach achieved this recognition by meeting the program's rigorous requirements, including maintaining a tree board or

department, implementing a tree care ordinance, allocating an annual community forestry budget of at least \$2 per capita, and hosting an Arbor Day observance and proclamation.

Update on the WPB Circuit

The City of WPB has heard our comments that emphasized the disadvantages that make Olive less desirable for public transit. They released a memorandum that revisits Sam Schwartz' conceptual transit recommendations for the City of WPB, including the North-South, East-West, and Downtown services. It also inventories and responds to the stakeholder and public comments received by the City between October 2023 and February 2024. Hurricane Readiness Guide

The Atlantic hurricane season runs from June 1 through November 30. Follow these links to learn how to keep yourself and your loved ones safe.

- <u>Yard debris</u>: you should keep your trees and shrubs in good trim now, since no green waste piles can be left out when a storm approaches. Keeping the streets clean of debris during the rainy season but especially during a storm is very important as the debris flows into the drains and causes Flagler to flood. Please remind your gardeners to remove the clippings and yard waste, even on Monday night, before the City picks up on Tuesday.
- <u>Vegetation Amnesty Days</u>: May 6th May 17th. During this period, residents are encouraged to take advantage of this opportunity to dispose of vegetative waste at no extra cost as the service charge will be waived. Residents can place an unlimited amount of vegetative waste curbside for pickup on their regularly scheduled yard waste pickup day. This includes grass clippings, leaves, trees, and shrubbery cuttings or trimmings, as well as broken or cut tree limbs and logs.
- Know your Evacuation Zone
- <u>Gather Supplies</u>: Have enough food, water, and other supplies for every member of your family to last at least 72 hours.
- <u>Make an Emergency Plan</u>: Make sure everyone in your household understands your hurricane plan.
- <u>Stay Informed</u>: Know where to go for trusted sources of information during a hurricane event.
- <u>Special Needs Shelters</u>: You must register with PBC in advance. Please call (561) 712-6400.

The purpose of the CCAN is to consider potential noise mitigation methods and suggest programs, concepts and resolution of complaints to the Department of Airports and Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners.
